BACKGROUND

India has made significant climate action commitments at the Conference of Parties (CoP-26) 2021.

The key commitments are:

- India's non-fossil energy capacity to reach 500 GW by 2030.
- India will meet 50% of its energy requirements from renewables by 2030.
- By 2030, India will reduce its total projected carbon emissions by 1 billion tonnes.
- By 2030, India will reduce the carbon intensity of its economy to less than 45%.
- By 2070, India will achieve the target for net zero emissions.

WHAT IS LCCM

Leaders in Climate Change Management (LCCM) is a practice-based learning program developed to aid India's ambitious climate targets by translating commitments into action on the ground. Starting in 2022, this program will build a pool of 5000 climate leaders across India over a period of 5 years.

The program offers participants from different streams - both in the public and private sector - an opportunity to understand the links between their

professional roles and climate positive action, and to feel confident about implementing such action.

The LCCM program uses a unique multi-phased 'learning by doing' approach, that offers scheduling flexibility to a learner, while being focused on their learning outcomes.

The program is launched with a focus on the urban sector.



SALIENT FEATURES OF THE PROGRAM

- Mixed learning by combining online and offline schedule.
- Customised program.
- Regular exclusive webinars, fireside chats and interactions with industry leaders
- Mentorship for project work.
- Become part of Community of Practice – an LCCM alumni network.
- Future events and engagement activities.
- International exposure visit.

The program is open for working professionals in the urban sector, both from the government and private sectors.

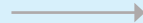
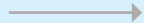
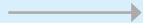
- Have access to a pool of climate change management leaders to guide transitions to low carbon processes.

PROGRAM DESIGN

The program is structured into 4 phases with online and in-person learning followed by a phase of project work, culminating in a certification event. A participant who successfully completes the program is connected to a Community of Practice for continued learning and collaboration.



LCCM PROGRAM



Phase I: Online Learning

- 8 weeks
- 8-10 modules
- 120-180 mins per module
- Core + elective topics
- Quiz for module completion

Phase II: In-person Learning

- 1 weeks visit to learning centre
- 4-6 full day sessions
- Group exercises
- Case discussions
- Field visit

Phase III: Project Work

- Over 6-8 months
- Project developed by participants with mentoring support
- International exposure visit

Phase IV: Course Completion

- Final presentation
- Enrollment into Community of Practice (alumni network)

COURSE STRUCTURE

Online Learning (Phase I): This will be a completely online (virtual) and self-paced phase where the Participants will have access to e-modules on an online learning portal. Key features include:

- The course will run for a period of 8-10 weeks, with 2-3 hours of effort/week.
- A participant can log in via their mobile phone or laptop/desktop to complete the course over a period of 8-10 weeks.
- Each e-module will be accompanied by a quiz.

In-person Learning (Phase II): In this phase, the participants will be grouped into cohorts of 30-35 and invited to come together for face-to-face learning for a week.

- The session will engage participants in groups of 30-40 and will run for 1 week.
- In this phase, participants will engage in case discussion and group exercises to test their

learnings from phase I and apply them to multidisciplinary real-life situations. It would also involve local site visit wherever possible.

Project Work (Phase III): In this phase, participants will work on specific projects over a period of 6-8 months.

- The projects will be guided by mentors, who will support participants in developing, detailing and implementing project ideas.
- A standout feature of the LCCM program in this phase will be exposure visit to an international location to experience and learn best practices.

Course Completion (Phase IV): In this final phase of the program, the participants will have the opportunity to reconvene as a cohort, share their project work and receive the course certification.

Community of Practice (an LCCM alumni network): The LCCM program offers another standout feature – the “Community of Practice”. Upon completing the course, participants become a part of an alumni network. This enables them to access resources, network with peers, mentors and faculties and get invited to online and offline events.

PROGRAM COST:

Indicative costing with an international exposure visit: INR 5,00,000 per person*

Indicative costing without an international exposure visit: INR 75,000 per person**

This cost includes all expenses towards the delivery of the 4 phases of LCCM program.

*Price may vary in case exposure visit conflicts with the peak international travel season.

** Price may vary in case there is a change in delivery partner institute hosting the Phase II in-person residential program.
